'TOPES START THE SEASON IN STYLE WITH 10-5 WIN: The Albuquerque Isotopes got three RBI apiece from Major League rehabbing Jay Gibbons and Triple-A rookie Dee Gordon to cruise to a 10-5 season-opening win over the Omaha Storm Chasers Thursday night at Isotopes Park. Locked in a tight battle through five frames, Albuquerque erupted for five runs in the sixth to blow the game wide open. Clinging to a 5-4 lead with a man on first and one out, Trayvon Robinson and Damaso Espino roped back-to-back singles to load the bases for Gordon, who sent a single to left-center, plating Jerry Sands and extending the advantage to 6-4 Isotopes. A single by Ivan De Jesus loaded the bases again for Gibbons, who sent a flare to the gap in right center that sent Omaha centerfielder Paulo Orlando and right fielder David Lough colliding into one another. As the ball rolled away, the Isotopes scampered around the bases with Gibbons coasting into second with three-run double that gave Albuquerque a commanding 10-4 lead. The 'Topes bullpen did the job from there, as Travis Schlichting, Scott Elbert, and Oscar Villareal combined to allow just one run, a solo homer by Omaha's Clint Robinson, his second of the game, in 3.2 innings to seal the victory.

THE MONASTERIOS MASH: Right-hander Carlos Monasterios makes his first start of the 2011 season coming off a year in which he spent most of his time in the Major Leagues with the Dodgers. After not having spent any time over Single-A, Monasterios parlayed a strong Spring Training into a spot with Los Angeles, where he was a versatile member of the Dodgers' staff, appearing in 19 games as a reliever and making 13 starts. Monasterios returns to Albuquerque for the first time since he started in a pair of games for the 'Topes on a Major League rehab assignment while recovering from a blister on his right hand. In two starts, the first on June 28 and the other on July 3, Monasterios allowed five runs, four earned, in 6.2 innings. His last outing before returning to the Major Leagues was particularly dominant, as he tossed three shutout innings in which he allowed just two hits while striking out one.

YOUTH IS SERVED: If the Isotopes' trio of Triple-A rookies were nervous before their debut last night they certainly didn't show it. Dee Gordon, Trayvon Robinson, and Jerry Sands combined for five of the Isotopes' total 11 hits on the night, four of the team's 10 RBI, and five of the 'Topes' 10 runs scored. Seemingly all of the hits were consequential as well. Sands' first Triple-A base hit drove in John Lindsey for Albuquerque's first run of the 2011 season. Three batters later, Gordon recorded his first Triple-A hit in the form

of a two-run single that helped the 'Topes to a 4-1, second-inning lead. Meanwhile, Robinson's base hit in the sixth helped extend Albuquerque's eventual game-clinching five-run rally.

LIVING SINGLE: Of the 11 hits the Isotopes banged out last night, only one was for extra bases, a sixth-inning, three-run double by Major League rehabbing outfielder Jay Gibbons.

A GOOD SIGN?: The last time the 'Topes beat Omaha at home to start a season was 2009, which was also the last year Albuquerque made the PCL Playoffs. In that victory, Jason Repko and Mitch Jones each blasted home runs to help lead the Isotopes to a 14-8 win over the then O-Royals.

IVAN RETURNS!: Just before batting practice yesterday, the Isotopes' already stacked infield was bolstered even more by the arrival of Ivan De Jesus Jr., who started the season with the Dodgers before being optioned on April 6. Last season, De Jesus was a stalwart in Albuquerque, playing in 130 games, second most on the Isotopes, while batting .296 with seven homers, 70 RBI and 33 doubles. After a torrid spring, De Jesus was named to the Dodgers Opening Day roster and made two starts at second base on April 1 and April 2.

HUGE HOMESTAND ROLLS ON: The Isotopes' season-opening homestand continues with more huge giveaways and great promotions. Tomorrow, the first 1,500 kids ages 12 and under will get a youth replica jersey and on Sunday the team rolls out its annual Salute to Public Safety Day! Don't forget on Monday, the Isotopes will have their first of three 50-Cent Hot Dog nights!
