# ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (1-2) AT OMAHA STORM CHASERS (2-1)

'TOPES BLANKED BY STORM CHASERS, 5-0: Three hits were all the Albuquerque Isotopes were able to muster as a trio of Omaha Storm Chasers pitchers conspired to silence the 'Topes' bats in a 5-0 Omaha win Saturday night at Werner Park. The Chasers offense wasted little time jumping out to a lead, scoring four runs in the very first frame. After loading the bases in the bottom of the first on two soft singles and a walk, 'Topes starter Stephen Fife seemed on the cusp of extricating himself from the jam, striking out two batters in succession and coaxing a ground ball toward second from David Lough. Alex Castellanos fielded the ball cleanly but threw wildly to first, allowing two runs to score and giving the Chasers a 2-0 lead. The two-out miscue seemed to open the flood gates, as Tony Abreu roped an RBI single to center and Cody Clark immediately added a run-scoring single up the middle of his own to put Omaha ahead 4-0 on four unearned runs. The Storm Chasers struck again on Fife in the bottom of the second when Derrick Robinson reached on a one-out infield single to shortstop before scampering to third on a single by Johnny Giavotella that went right between the pitcher Fife's legs. The starter was then replaced by reliever Francisco Felix, who allowed a sacrifice fly by Max Ramirez to give Omaha a 5-0 cushion. That was more than enough for Chasers starter Nate Adcock, who cruised through 5.1 innings, allowing just two hits while walking two and striking out five. Reliever Francisley Bueno added 1.2 scoreless innings of his own in which he fanned four before Louis Coleman finished off the shutout with two more scoreless frames, allowing a hit and a walk while striking out one.

CAN YOU HEAR THE DRUMS FERNANDO?: Veteran right-hander Fernando Nieve makes his Isotopes debut in what will be his third team in the PCL's American Southern Division. NONE SHALL (FREE) PASS: Through three games, nobody in the Pacific Coast League has surrendered fewer walks than Isotopes pitchers, who have issued just four free passes in 25.0 total innings. 'Topes relievers have been even stingier giving up bases on balls, allowing just one walk in 13.2 innings of work. Conversely, Albuquerque's opponent this series Omaha has yielded the most free passes, walking 16 Isotopes in 27.0 innings.

SEARCHING FOR A SPLIT: Albuquerque closes out its season-opening series with the Storm Chasers looking to salvage a split in the four-game set. If the 'Topes fall, it will be the third straight series defeat (all on the road) dating back to last year, when Albuquerque finished off the season losing a series at Memphis and getting swept in four game at Round Rock.

TOPS IN HIS FIELDS: Not only has Josh Fields gotten a hit in each of his three games played this season, he's currently working on a 13-game away on-base streak that dates back to early last season when he was a member of the Colorado Spring Sky Sox. Beginning on May 19, Fields reached base in 10 straight games away from Sky Sox Stadium before he was granted his release in order to sign with Japan's Yomiuri Giants. The infielder's current streak is tied with Salt Lake's Ryan Langerhans for the fourth longest in the PCL behind Sacramento's Chris Carter (16) and Jermaine Mitchell (15) and Fresno's Justin Christian and Conor Gillaspie

TODAY'S START: Veteran right-hander Fernando Nieve makes his first start of the season for the Isotopes after splitting last season with Triple-A Oklahoma City and the Doosan Bears of the Korean Baseball Organization. Nieve appeared in seven games (one start) for the Dodgers in Spring Training, posting a 3.00 ERA (5 ER / 15.0 IP).

2011: Spent a majority of the season pitching for the Doosan Bears in the Korean Baseball Organization... appeared in 25 games going 3-6 and a 6.09 ERA... finished the season tied for third on the team with six saves... also fanned 66 batters which ranked fourth amongst Bears pitchers... started the season with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Houston organization where he made three starts for the RedHawks, going 1-2 with a 7.63 ERA (13 ER / 15.1 IP)... granted his release on April 27.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Spent the majority of the 2010 season with New York (NL)... was Designated for Assignment on July 23rd and optioned to Triple-A Buffalo on July 27... made 40 appearances for New York and had one start, May 29 at Milwaukee, an 8-6 loss... in 2.0 innings, he gave up three hits, five runs, all earned, with three walks and five strikeouts... became the first pitcher in Mets franchise history to appear in 19 of the team's first 30 games... picked up victories in relief vs. the Cubs on April 19 (1.1 scoreless innings with one hit) and vs. Detroit at Citi Field on June 22 (2.1 innings, no hits, no runs, with a walk and four strikeouts)... in seven June games, went 1-0 with a 3.12 ERA (3 ER / 8.2 IP and eight hits)... worked a career-best 10.2 consecutive scoreless innings in nine appearances from April 17-May 3, giving up five hits, with three walks and 10 strikeouts... struck out a season-high four in 2.1 innings vs. Detroit on June 22... went a season-best 3.0 innings vs. Cincinnati on July 5, permitting one run on three hits... made eight straight starts for Buffalo upon his return to the Bisons... scored back-to-back victories against Scranton Wilkes-Barre on August 11 and against Pawtucket on August 16... went at least 6.0 innings in four of his eight Triple-A starts.

In 2009 went to Spring Training with Houston... was claimed off waivers by New York (NL) on March 13 and assigned to Double-A Binghamton... promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on May 18 and had his contract purchased by the Mets on June 5... placed on the 15-Day Disabled List on July 20 with a muscle tear in his right thigh and did not pitch for the rest of the season... tore the muscle during his start on July 19 at Atlanta... finished the season with the best ERA of his career (2.95)... Major League batters went hitless against him with runners in scoring position and two out (0-for-10)... made his Mets debut on June 6 with 2.0 scoreless innings out of the bullpen in a 7-1 loss at Washington, allowing one hit and striking out two... beat New York (AL), 6-2, on June 13, going 6.2 innings and allowing five hits and two runs, his first win since June 25, 2006 at Chicago (AL) and his first win as a starter since June 9, 2006 vs. Atlanta... the 6.2 innings marked the righthander's longest outing since the June 9 start vs. Atlanta... beat St. Louis with 6.0 shutout innings on June 24 at home to establish a career-best three game winning streak... became the first Mets pitcher to win his first three starts with the team since Jorge Sosa in 2007... also tied his careerbest scoreless streak with the 6.0 shutout innings on June 24... went at least 6.0 innings in each of his four starts at Buffalo, winning his first three turns... on the day of his promotion to the Bisons, made the start at Pawtucket and earned the 9-2 win with 6.0 innings of two-run ball, allowing three hits and six walks, while striking out seven.
